Year 4, Autumn Term 1

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to Year 4! We have two sessions of P.E. a week, which will be on Monday afternoon and Friday morning. Please ensure that the children come to school in their PE kit on these days and that they keep their indoor plimsolls in their school locker ready

for indoor P.E. in the hall.

As the children begin to engage in our first topic 'I am Warrior', they will discover what life was life in Britain before the Roman invasion; building their very own Celtic roundhouses up on the school field. We are excited about marching further into the topic when we learn first-hand more about Roman Britain from **UP AN' AT 'EM! HISTORY**.

Throughout the half term, we shall continue to step back in time to ask 'What have the Romans ever done for us?' - exploring when and why the Romans invaded and what they did to change the face of Britain forever.

The children will be recapping learning they have done previously in Year 3 by looking at different ways to structure sentences. These will include simple sentences and using simple conjunctions to create compound sentences. We will recap their knowledge of coordinating conjunctions (FANBOYS). To prove they have understood these different structures, the children will write independent sentences about different pictures.	The children will look at a range of opening paragraphs of different stories to investigate how a range of sentence structures can engage the reader. We will start by identifying adverbial phrases in existing sentences and explore how these can be re-organised to create interesting sentence openers. The children will then apply their skills to write the start of a story about the Romans.	
Maths		

Place Value

The children will focus on recognising the place value of each digit in 4-digit numbers and become confident in ordering, rounding and finding 1000 more or less than a given number. They will then start to apply this knowledge to solve problems whilst reasoning and explaining their thinking.

Addition

The children will further their ability to partition numbers in different ways to build a range of mental strategies for addition. They will focus on estimating and using inverse operations to check answers to calculations, and begin to add numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of column addition.

Roman Numerals

Linking to our Romans topic, the children will learn to identify Roman numerals (up to 100) noticing how the number system changed today. They will use this knowledge to problem solve with a focus on verbal mathematical reasoning.

Outline of our Learning Journey

Week 1 and 2: Life before the Romans



In the first weeks of our new unit, we will be learning about the Celts and how they lived in England before the Romans invaded. We will look the types of houses that they lived in and the jobs that they did so we can understand later in the unit how life changed when the Romans arrived.

Week 3 and 4: Where the Romans came from and why they were so successful



The children will be learning about where the Romans came from and why they came. We will be moving our learning on by looking at why the Romans were so successful. The two reasons for the Roman's success that we will be looking at in depth are the Roman army (battle formations) and Roman inventions that we still use today!

Week 5 and 6: Who is Boudicca and why did she rebel?



In weeks 5 and 6 we will learning about who Boudicca was and why she started a rebellion against the Romans. We will be finding what the Romans did to her to make her rebel and we will be exploring her problem from the viewpoints of a Roman and a Celt to understand how historical sources can disagree.

Week 7: Life under Roman rule and the legacy they have left behind


