It is great to have children back in the classroom and learning again! The children have all settled in really well and it is great to see them engaged in their learning in Year 5. In Year 5, we have two sessions of PE a week: Monday and Friday. The children are beginning to engage in our first topic 'Off with her Head'. Throughout this unit, we will be exploring the question, 'How did Henry VIII change England to be as we know it today?'

Literacy Throughout our literacy learning this year, we are going to be learning about how to write for a range of purposes. Our focus for this half term is writing to entertain. Letter writing and setting description Book: Treason by Berlie Doherty We will focus on how authors write to entertain. The unit will begin by consolidating our Year 4 learning of adverbials and sentence structures to ensure these skills are secure. The journey will then focus on moving to the Year 5 English coverage where we will explore how to use paragraphs accurately and how to introduce them. Through letter writing, we will explore how we can add more detail through the use of relative clauses and develop our understanding of vocabulary through showing a character's thoughts and feelings. **Mathematics** Place value Addition and Subtraction Children will develop their understanding of place This unit will build on the learning that took place value by looking at numbers up to seven digits in Year 4. Children will learn how to add and long. Our knowledge will then be applied to help subtract using the column method, moving over us to order and compare numbers.
