


TTRS Comic Relief Competition

Use of Lateral Flow Tests

We have been asked by the LA to clarify that LFT are only to be used for **regular testing where no one is suspected of having Covid-19**. The purpose of these tests is to spot cases in the community that we wouldn't otherwise have known about.

Families should not use these tests on themselves or their children if they have symptoms. **A PCR test at a national testing centre must be booked where infection is suspected.** A lateral flow test could fail to spot someone who is just developing an infection but a PCR test will not. Having symptoms, getting a negative LFT result and assuming you are virus free could result in you spreading the virus to others.





Bounceback Wellbeing

This week, all children have continued with their Bounce Back lessons to focus on wellbeing.



The children have continued their learning about 'Getting Back on Track' and across the school children have reflected on the sessions they did last week. They have built on their learning about feelings and discussed the things they can control and the things they cannot control. In EYFS, the children have discussed how they need to give each other space and respect personal space as well as discussing their feelings. In KS1 the children have been discussing feelings and friendship and what makes a good friend / how to be a good friend. In KS2, children have been learning about empathy and understanding how things might be different for others. Many children have explored the idea of having a 'guardian angel' and also how they can show random acts of kindness. Across the school, there have been some really positive discussions and lots of opportunities for talk and sharing their views.


Do you know a landscaper?
