This term, Year 2 have been enjoying their science learning in our current topic called 'Wriggle and Crawl'.

Last week, the children set up a fair test experiment to try and find out what a bean needs to grow; in our classes we decided that they would probably need light, water and soil. For our experiment, we planted our first set of beans without soil, our second set of beans we gave no light, our third set of beans we are not going to water and our fourth set of beans we gave everything. The children have come up with some super predictions about what they think will happen but they need to be patient to find out.

For the last two weeks, we have also been really lucky to have some crawling visitors in our classrooms! Each class have been observing a group of caterpillars to see how they change over time and record this in their own diary. So far we have seen our baby caterpillars begin to grow because they have been eating their nutritious food and also build webs around themselves for protection. We are all very excited to see what will happen over the next few weeks!
