




Year 3 – Ancient Greece

This half term, Year 3 are learning all about a new topic called 'Gods and Mortals'. Within this topic, the children will be learning all about the history of Ancient Greece.

To begin their learning, Year 3 became Historians and worked out when this time period was. They learnt what chronology means and they made a timeline, divided into BCE (Before the Common Era) and CE (Common Era). They plotted key events and time periods in history that they have already learnt about. This week Year 3 also learnt about the differences between Athens and Sparta in Ancient Greece and had the chance to dress up! They chose a side and designed a shield so they could join in with the Peloponnesian war!



Year 6 - Easter Story


Year 6 have begun a new unit called Salvation in R.E focusing on the importance of Easter for Christians. This week we have been re-capping the Easter story. Here is Zain's retelling of the Easter story.

Spring 2 and Year 4 have begun their new and exciting topic of Road Trip USA. We started with a virtual engage afternoon – quite different from any engage day we have had before!

This term our new topic is called Road Trip U.S.A. We are excited to learn about American history. We are also looking forward to learning about their famous buildings, people, places and Native Americans.
