Water Bottle Hygiene

We encourage children to bring in their own water bottle from home which will be kept on their desk. Please try to provide a bottle that is large enough to last all day without being refilled if possible to minimise risks of contamination and make sure that it is clearly named. Good hygiene including daily washing is essential. Public Health has issued the following advice for schools;

- Water bottles should not be shared
- Ideally bottles should be clear plastic
- Water bottles should be washed daily in warm soapy water, rinsed, and left to air dry upside down
- Nozzles of a sports cap should be opened and flushed through during cleaning
- Bottles can also be washed in a dishwasher, with bottle and cap separated
