# We all need to work together to keep our community safe

At school, we absolutely can't wait for all the children to return to school on Monday. I think as a school community; children, parents and staff, we can all be very proud of the resilience and determination we have shown in lockdown. To support the children's safe return to school, it is

essential that we all play our part in helping to reduce cases and stop the spread of the virus. Yesterday we sent a booklet outlining our plan for fully reopening the school. Please follow the guidelines carefully to protect your child and those of others too. Remember that very simple measures, such as wearing your mask when dropping off and collecting children, maintaining distance where it is possible to do so and ensuring that any children who are waiting with you at collection times are staying within the family bubble are essential to keeping everyone safe. We ask that you move quickly away from collection points. If older siblings collect younger children from our school, please remind them that they should go alone to do this, rather than being accompanied by friends. Reminding your child to practise good hand hygiene, social distancing and only using their own equipment is also important in helping to stop the spread of the virus. Thank you for everything that you have done and continue to do to support us. It has been such a difficult time with the management of home-learning alongside your own responsibilities and commitments. Hopefully, the full opening of schools will ease some of those pressures, as well as giving children and young people the chance to learn and socialise with people their own age and to feel that brighter times are ahead for all of us.







#### Year 2 - Easter Story
