It has been so lovely this week to see the children so excited about their new classes for next year. Thank you so much for all your support in preparing them for the new school year.

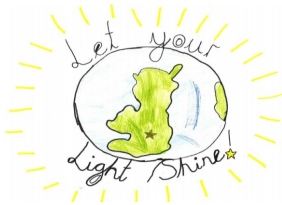

# SUMMER FAIR

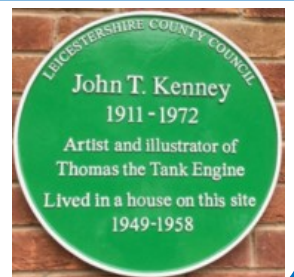

## YEAR 4 HAVE BEEN LEARNING ALL ABOUT

# SOUND

This term, we have been learning about sound. We have learnt the outside part of your ear is called the pinna. Your pinna is used to store sound waves and channel them to the ear canal. The ear canal connects the inner and outer ear. At the end of the ear canal, is the ear drum. The ear drum vibrates when hit causing a bit of sound. When the ear drum is hit, the hammer vibrates and moves forward to hit the anvil. The anvil then hit the stirrup. The stirrup moves forward to the cochlea. Then the nerves tell the brain. The cochlea is filled with liquid and tiny nerves. Having two ears benefits you so you can find the direction easier. The pinna (your outer ear) is shaped for its purpose because it sticks out and it is curved. The word pitch means how high or low a sound is. For example, a piano's last key is really deep however the key is really high. Volume means how loud or how quiet a sound is so if there was a lion growling it would be loud but an insect moving would be very quite. The stirrup is the smallest bone in the human body. The cochlea is shaped like a snail. Also there is a tiny hair on the edge of the cochlea which tells the auditory nerve there is a sound. Sound waves travel through the air.
