Year 3 - It's All Greek to Me!

In Year 3, we have been learning about the wonderful world of Ancient Greece in our topic 'Gods and Mortals'. To engage ourselves in this topic, Year 3 had a Greek day, full of learning and fun activities. The children arrived at school dressed in their Greek outfits. We had Greek gods, goddesses, governors, and even some mythical creatures like Medusa. In the morning, we tasted some Greek foods like Olives, Pita Bread and Tzatziki sauce. Then we learned about The Peloponnesian war that was fought between two great cities of Ancient Greece, Sparta and Athens. The children became historians as they hunted around the classroom for various facts about each city and their people. The children compared the cities as Athens were a democracy and Sparta were a monarchy. They also learned that it was the Spartans who reigned victorious in the war when they borrowed some ships from the nearby Persians. In the afternoon, each class split into two and made shields. Some made shields for Athens, featuring their blue colours and the Athenian owl emblem. Others made shields for Sparta, which had their famous red colours and legendary Spartan helmet. All in all, it was a fun and engaging day, finding out about the wonders of the Ancient Greece.
