Year 4 - Roman Day

Last week, Year 4 stepped back 2000 years for a taste of Roman life! We practiced battle formations on the field such as the 'Testudo' (when the shields are held up to make a shell around the soldiers) and then went toe to toe with the Celtic army (played by more Year 4s). Our Roman visitors also brought in some Roman artillery and we were able to shoot arrows and balls at different targets. The large bow could shoot arrows all the way to the other side of the field! It became easy to understand how the disciplined Roman army, with their superior weapons, armour and formations, were able to defeat the much larger Celtic force.

Inside the classroom, we handled Roman artefacts and guessed at what they could have been used for. When they realised they had been holding a 'botty brush' (used to clean your bottom) they were all thankful for the toilets we have today! We also handled the different weapons, armour and shields that a Roman soldier would have used before going into the playground for marching practice.

To finish the day we had a quiz to see what everyone had remembered. The prize for a right answer I hear you ask? Well that was shooting the teachers with the Roman artillery!


Books the children have enjoyed this summer;
