Year 1—Superheroes

Year 1 have had a great start to the new year with their superhero topic. In Science the children have been super scientists and used their five senses to investigate sounds, smells and tastes - the children preferred the chocolate to the sour lemon! In History the children have focused on toys and how they have changed over time. They got to look at toys from the past and compared them with their own toys from today. They began to look at creating a timeline of toys from the past to the future. In Literacy the children have really enjoyed retelling the story of Supertato, they started off by creating their own story map and sequenced sentences from the story. This week the children have re-written their narrative of Supertato using capital letters, full stops, the joining word "and" plus some ace adjectives. In Art, the children have been focusing on their pencil skills. They started off learning how to draw lines and different shapes. This built up to the children drawing their own superhero skyline and applying their skill of shading to their drawings. To finish off the super learning on superheroes we had an afternoon today of celebrating and showcasing some of our fantastic learning to some people from The Well in Kibworth. We set up an afternoon tea in the hall and all joined together to talk about and show our superhero topic work. We are excited to start our next topic in Year 1 – "Enchanted Woodlands" and share our super home learning after half term.
