#### Year - First Aid Training

Last week, the Year 4 pupils were treated to a First Aid session from St. John's Ambulance. The pupils learned how to bandage different parts of the body. They learned how to apply bandages to the arms, legs, head and hand. They now know that all of the edges need to be under wraps and how tight the bandage needs to be.

They also learned how to do a primary survey and assess for danger. The first step is looking for danger, then finding out if the person will respond to them. They would then check the airways by tipping the head back and checking if they are breathing or not. Finally they check for colour and then check for blood around the body.

They then learned how to put somebody into the recovery position and when this would be needed. The pupils then discussed how to make a 999 call and state clearly what their emer-

gency is and what information they would need to give the operator e.g. the address and what is wrong with the casualty.

All of the pupils had a great time and they all said they felt confident they could assist someone in an emergency. A special thank you to Steve our wonderful instructor!



#### **Reading Volunteers**

We are lucky to have the fantastic support of a small band of reading volunteers across the school. They give help to children of all ages and abilities to practice this key skill and this is much appreciated. I was delighted to listen to a fantastic year 4 reading session in the reading shack led by Lindsay Stonehouse this week.
