There were nerves, excitement and definitely laughter as our Year 6 children returned to their classrooms this Monday for the first time in 10 weeks. They have settled in quickly and got used to the routines of social distancing, handwashing and individual desks. For the staff and I it has been a happy time and we are all mightily relieved that our plans have worked, and all our anxiety was not necessary.

The school feels very much part of the Kibworth Community and I really believe that it is the whole community – parents, children, governors and staff – along with the DSAT Academy who have made it possible to welcome so many children into school. Thank you all so much!

Today we have 220 children attending school, all playing and learning in their bubbles of 15. Every single space in school is now being used as a classroom and the staff are working flat out to work in school whilst also maintaining the online learning for those children still learning at home. I sadly have to inform you that we finally have to admit defeat and let you all know that we will not be able to reintegrate any more year groups into school this term.

This week we are starting a new initiative. Our teachers are going to use Teams to run live chats with all children not in school. Parents have received an email and have been asked to complete a form by 9am on the 22nd June. HERE

We know it's not like being in school but it will give children chance to see their teachers and hopefully take part in a Q and A session with the teachers they will have in September.

With all this going on I really do hope the weather forecast is correct and next week we will be back to enjoying some seasonal sunshine. Have a super weekend everyone!

For the last 10 days, children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 have taken part in the DSAT Times Table Rockstar competition in which many children performed outstandingly. The competition has been an integral aspect of home learning and in school learning whereby children are practicing and consolidating their recall of times tables an essential life skill that is a fundamental part of maths.

Overall, out of the 13 schools that took part, Kibworth Primary School is extremely proud to have come first being the highest scoring school with a total of 666,767 points and a victory margin of over 29,000 points.

Congratulations to 5S who had Kibworth's highest average score per player with 4w and 5S close behind. 4W were our highest scoring class with 106,741 points. There was certainly some inter-school competitiveness!

Our highest scoring pupils were Ellie in 5S, Jack in 6H and Freddie in 4M who placed a phenomenal position of 6th, 7th and 23rd Respectively across all the DSAT schools. We would like to thank all pupils, parents and teachers for taking part in the competition. Children, please continue the brilliant job of regularly practising your times tables! Well done Kibworth Primary School for letting your light shine.


