Foundation learning this week

This half term EYFS are learning all about Pets. The children have enjoyed bringing in photos of their own pets to share with the class. This week we have had a visit from Mrs Swales's rabbit Spike and Mila's tortoise Tiddles. The children have enjoyed learning about how to look after different pets and writing their own fact files. We are very excited about our visit from Pets at Home later on in the term.







Many year groups last week started new topics and as a result there was some great evidence of the new learning that has been taking place shared in our KS2 Celebration Assembly. Year 6's new topic is called 'Revolution' in which they are learning all about the changes that took place in Victorian society. This week they have learnt about William Wilberforce and the determination that he showed in fighting to abolish slavery across the British Empire. They shared that sadly, he died only one month before he could see his dreams come to fruition in 1833. In Year 5, as part of their 'Space' topic, the children are composing musical scores. This week they explored the timbre of different instruments by listening to

'Peter and the Wolf' and investigating why certain instruments were used to represent certain animals. They also explored texture in different pieces of music exploring how many different rhythms and instruments are layered to create a piece of music. We are looking forward to seeing what fantastic learning will be shared next time!
