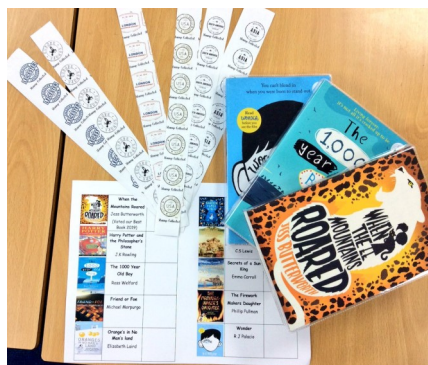
At KPS we believe that good manners are essential and the teaching of these is at the centre of our curriculum. This week **2P** and **6M** have been recognised as having the best manners in school.

## Year 6 - World War Two

This half term, we have been learning about World War Two and how this affected the lives of innocent British civilians. Wanting more room for his people, Hitler invaded Austria, the Sudetenland, Czechoslovakia and Poland. At this point, Britain and France gave Germany an ultimatum: withdraw from Poland or we declare war. World War Two began on the 3<sup>rd</sup> September 1939.

In September 1940, the Blitz began. German bombers came and attacked naval bases such as Plymouth; cities with munitions factories such as Coventry and Birmingham; as well as our capital city – London – in the hope of destroying British morale.

Because of this, many children in main cities had to be evacuated and taken to the countryside. When Britain knew that the Germans were bombing cities, they introduced blackouts which were when people had to block out their lights so that the Luftwaffe couldn't see where they were. The British Government also gave out over 38 million gas masks because they didn't know if the Germans were going to drop bombs with toxic gas in them. If the German Luftwaffe were coming, a high pitched rising and falling siren sounded which would warn civilians and tell them to get inside a shelter or somewhere safe.
