# Year 3: Spring Term 1 Tremors

Curriculum Information

Dear Parents,

This half term our new topic is called 'Tremors' and we will be learning about natural disasters, such as volcanoes and earthquakes.

# Literacy

## Writing Reading


This term we will be exploring non-fiction texts. The children will continue to explore different sentence structures and ways to improve their writing when creating a diary entry about a natural disaster. We will be using conjunctions we have already learnt (FANBOYS and AWHITEBUS) within our writing to show time and

cause. Later in the term, the children will write a newspaper report and will learn how to use inverted commas to punctuate speech.

simple, Compound & Complex Sentences! This half term we will be reading a range of non-fiction texts such as diary entries and newspaper reports. We will be continuing to develop our comprehension skills when reading, to allow us to gain a better understanding of the text. Our guided reading sessions will develop their fluency, expression and comprehension skills. The comprehension skills we will be focussing on are retrieval, inference and exploring new vocabulary. Alongside their reading at school we would like you to listen to your child read every day and ask questions to aid their understanding of the text. Please record this in their reading diary.

#### Maths

### Fractions Times Tables



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For this half term, we will first be consolidating the children's understanding of mental methods for addition and subtraction and revisiting the written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will then move on to learn about fractions of shape and fractions of number. We will use this knowledge to add and subtract different fractions and to find equivalent fractions. Throughout the term we will use a range of reasoning and problem-solving skills to

apply what we have learnt.

The times tables that children must know by the end of year three are 2,3,4,5, 6, 8 and 10. We are continuing to work on teaching the children to not only be able to chant times tables, but be able to recall them in any



order rapidly. This quick mental recall will help the children complete questions mentally at speed and will allow children to progress to multiplying two digit numbers using a written method. Any extra support at home will really benefit your child's rapid recall of their times tables out of order.

		the term we will explore where natural disasters have occurred in Europe and use
		maps to locate them.

	_	explore existing bridges and find out what makes them successful. We will design a
		bridge and look at different ways to strengthen it using a range of materials and
		equipment. After making our bridges, we will evaluate them to find out whose is the
		strongest and would survive a natural disaster.
Science	Forces	Within Science this term we will be learning about magnets and forces. We will be
		investigating a range of different forces and the impact that different materials
		have on friction. We will explore magnetism and find out why some magnets attract
		or repel. We will become Scientists and plan an experiment to find out whether a
		material is magnetic or not.
RE	How do	Our RE learning will be focussing on what is prayer and how people can pray. We will
	people pray?	explore what it means to pray and communicate to God and we will compare the
		different ways that Christians, Muslims and Hindus pray.
PE	Swimming	Swimming is not taking place until further notice.
	Outdoor PE	Outdoor PE will take place on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning. They
		will need to come in appropriate school PE kit for the weather. This should include
		warm and waterproof clothing.
