If love feels like the sun... What colour is it? What does it feel like? What does it sound like? What does it smell like?

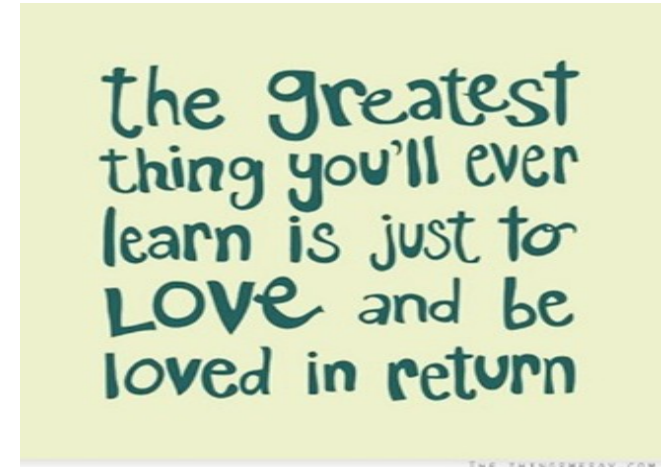
