At school we have put in place specific Covid mitigation measures which have enabled us to welcome some visitors to school. It was great to see our "super scientists" enjoying their chromatography experiment this week and I'm looking forward to the rest of the after school clubs starting soon. Jedd led an inspiring history session for

year 4 and we have also been able to welcome back our music tutors who are teaching a wide variety of instruments as well as providing singing lessons.

It has been lovely to have some sun and to see the children enjoy being in our newly revamped Peace Garden. They have been sharing some books focussing on this month's value – Hope. I know many of you have a wealth of knowledge about children's literature so if you have any suggestions to add to the Hope Library do please let me know.

Sadly, I continue to be concerned about Covid 19. In recent weeks both Market Harborough and Oadby and Wigston have seen rising rates of Covid 19 infection. We now know of several cases in the village and at our school. Public Health advice is that from August 16th, in line with step 4 of the government's COVID-19 roadmap, under 18s identified as close contacts of someone testing positive for COVID-19 no longer need to self-isolate. Instead, they are advised to get a PCR test as soon as possible. These changes have come about as a result of the success of the vaccine programme. However, Covid 19 remains a serious health risk and we all need to be cautious in order to protect ourselves and others. Please make sure you stay alert and vigilant for the symptoms of the virus in your households. If your child is showing any signs of symptoms, no matter how mild, please arrange for them to have a PCR test. Self-isolation is still required for those symptomatic, and for anyone who tests positive.

We ask that you help us to minimise Covid 19 infection by;

- Wearing face coverings in enclosed spaces or crowded places
- Staying at home if you think you or your child has symptoms
- Washing hands with soap for at least 20 seconds when moving between spaces. We have recently been informed that sickness in young children can also be an indicator of Covid 19. Could I also just make sure that everyone knows that we are not able to let children give out snacks or presents when it is their birthday. This is to avoid allergies, parental preference and infection transference.

Goodbye Mr Attkinson

Today we said "goodbye" to our Premises Officer. Mr Attkinson has done a sterling job keeping the school and grounds maintained over the last two years. All the staff and children wish him well for the future.


