In some ways the pandemic has emphasised the negative impact people's words and actions can have on each other. Uniform reminder

Please can you ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform to come to school in. We believe that our uniform encourages a sense of pride in appearance and a feeling of belonging to the school family. This assists in developing high standards in other aspects of school life.

- The basic uniform comprises grey or black trousers or skirts, a white shirt or polo shirt and a blue jumper or cardigan. In the summer children can choose to wear blue and white summer dresses.
- It is expected that haircuts will be conventional, and children are presented in a smart way.
- Only black low-heeled shoes are allowed. No Trainers
- Jewellery, including friendship and wristbands, are not allowed. The only exception is where a child has pierced ears, and then one pair only of small plain studs are acceptable. Earrings must not be worn for PE.
- Nail varnish or make-up is not permitted.
