Year 6—A Child's War

This week, Year 6 began their new topic 'A Child's War'. Over the next eight weeks, the children are going to learn all about how World War II impacted the everyday lives of British civilians from finding out about the Blitz to considering what it would have been like to have been evacuated.



As part of our 'Engage', we spent an afternoon this week exploring what life might have been like for a child at the beginning of World War II. Outside, we played games popular at the time: children hop-



scotched their way down the playground; performed clapping rhymes at immense speeds; chased hoops round and round; and challenged themselves to see how many children they could have skipping under one rope!



Back in the classroom, we learnt about air raid drills. It was explained to children that due to fear of aerial bombing from the German Luftwaffe, children in 1939 would have practiced sheltering under their desks when the air raid siren sounded. After a

few practises, classes had the air raid drill completed in a mere 6 seconds!



We are really looking forward to the rest of our topic and learning lots more about World War II.
