UKRAINE APPEAL

This week our school leaders have been discussing the war in Ukraine with many parents after drop off at the school gates. I know many of us have been watching events in the news with a mixture of shock and horror and that you have raised concerns about what to say to your children. With this in mind some of the classes are making kindness cards for the children who have been evacuated to Poland. These cards will be delivered by our friends at Kibworth Easy Riders Cycling Club. The club are taking a van out on the 23rd March and have asked for our help to collect items to fill the van. They are particularly asking for donations for babies-clothing, nappies, toiletries, pocket tissues, baby food, powdered milk, and unopened children's over the counter medicines like Calpol. They are also asking for basic medical supplies-First Aid kits, bandages, wound closure strips, sterile dressings and surgical tape. Finally, if you have any small teddy bears or cuddly toys to donate these would also be greatly appreciated. We only have a week to gather our donations so please could we ask you to place any donations in the wicker basket in the entrance hall or hand in to school staff at the gates or in reception. **The deadline is Friday 18th March.** As always we thank you for your amazing support.

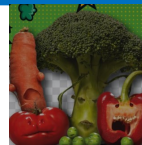
