Ukraine Update from Kibworth Easyriders CC

We travelled to Poland from Thursday 24th March until Wednesday 30th March with 2 fully loaded large vans, including a mountain of donations from Kibworth Primary School. Thank you for being so generous with your donations as we have seen first hand, that they have really made a difference- the toys particularly gave the children big smiles! When we got to Poland, we were directed to the town of Zamosc where we were introduced to a house full of Ukrainian evacuees where we were able to hand out any supplies they needed most. We also handed out the cards that the school had sent to their children which was a very emotional experience for both us and them, messages of hope and love meant the world to these people. We spent a day buying 4 full trolleys of food and a tall freezer to keep the food fresh in which was received with thanks and tears. It was so nice for us to see that we had made a difference to the lives of 40 Ukrainians who have been living in fear. All was made possible by the generosity of every single person who donated and gave time for this effort. A huge thank you!
