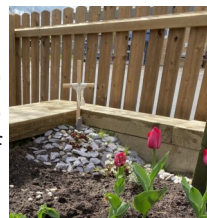
Iris enjoyed spending time painting this picture of a fox during the holidays with her grandma using oil pastels and paint.

Year 6 Revolution Topic

Year 6's topic last term was called Revolution during which we learnt all about the changes that took place in society during the 1800s. The children learnt about how the British Empire spread across the globe making the nation the strongest and the most powerful in the world. At the same time though, we also learnt how Britain was involved in the slave trade and the impact that this had on the lives of millions of innocent Africans. Children learnt about those people, such as William Wilberforce, who stood up against this barbaric act and ultimately fought about the abolition of slavery across the Empire. We were then interested to learn about all the different jobs that children undertook during the Victorian times and how social reformers, such as Lord Shaftesbury, fought to end child labour and provide children with the opportunity to access free education. At the end of our unit, to show and share their learning, the children made board games. Children came up with a brilliant range of ideas and used their knowledge to create questions which were to be a key part of their game. The children were then able to play these games and test their knowledge on the topic.
