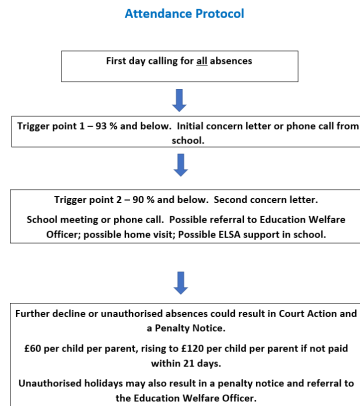

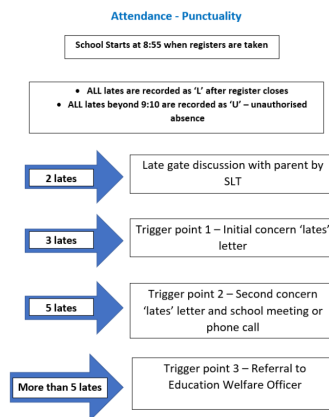
School Attendance and Punctuality

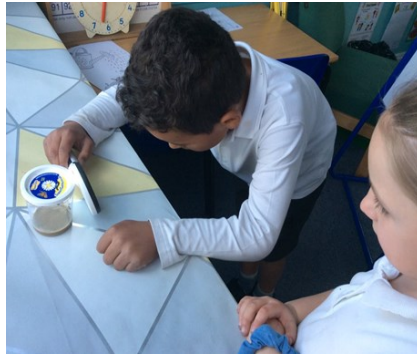
