
# Outline of our Learning Journey:

# Weeks 1 -4: Following our learning about the History of America before Easter, we will now learn about the slave trade and plantation life. We will then learn about Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King and their links to the Civil Rights Movement. Week 5: We will discover how sound is made and how its volume and pitch changes. We will be able to name the parts of a human ear and know their role.
