This half term we will be exploring the Anglo Saxons and Vikings as part of our 'Traders and Raiders' Topic. This will include learning about the reasons they came to Britain, we will explore what their life here was like.

English

Non Fiction texts

Our Literacy learning will be focused around looking at non fiction texts, We will be deepening our learning of how to identify and use both Structural and language features, using causal and contrasting conjunctions and commas to mark clauses, we will use a range of sentence structures to create a class newspaper featuring Anglo Saxon life.

Reading



This half term we will continue to work on the skills needed to be able to understand and answer questions on a text. Our Fiction reading will be based around 'Erik the Viking' by Terry Jones. We will be continuing to use all 5 of our reading characteristics for the remainder of the term.

Science	Sound	To know how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating To know that vibrations from sound travel through a medium to the ear To know there are patterns between the pitch of a sound and the features of the object that produced To know how to identify patterns between the volume of sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it To know that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.
History	Anglo Saxons and their life in Britain	To know the similarities and differences between two periods of history, To know how to place different periods of time on a timeline and remember key historical facts and some dates from a period studied. To know how to explain that an event can have more than one cause. To know how to ask and answer more complex questions through independent research. To know how to choose the best way to record a range of historical information, giving reasons for their choice. To know how to use a range of source materials to answer questions about the past, which go beyond simple observations.
Art	Collagraph	To know about the technique of collagraph and apply the principles to their own work. To know about contemporary artists Andrea Starkey and Mari French. To know how to investigate the different textures and materials used in a collagraph. To know how to investigate different printing techniques by experimentation. To know how to create a collagraph print and that the image will be reversed. To know how to sketch an idea which then develops into a printed collagraph. To know how to reflect on their art journey and develop ideas based on ideas which are successful, and those which need refining. To know how to create a series of collagraph prints inspired by nature.

Outline of our Learning Journey:

Weeks 1 -3:



We will discover how sound is made and how its volume and pitch changes. We will be able to name the parts of a human ear and know their role.

Week 4:



We will learn about which tribes the Anglo-Saxons were from and where and when they they came from. We will find out why Britain was their choice and where in Britain they did settle and where they avoided and why! We will discover some of their legacy left here today and think about how it compares with other times of History we know about.

Weeks 1-5:


