OPAL Programme

The school is about to start a programme to improve opportunities for MILANING 44 physical activity, socialisation, cooperation, coordination, resilience, creativity, imagination and enjoyment through improved play. OPAL is based on the idea that, as well as learning through good teaching, your children also learn when they play. As 20% of their time in school is playtime, we want to make sure that this time is as good as possible. One reason the school is carrying out this programme is that childhood has changed, and many children no longer get their play needs met out of school. Average screen time per day is six hours, average outdoor play time per week is five hours.

We will be sending out a letter next week seeking some parents to be part of the working group who develop this programme. The commitment would be a few days over the year including the morning of the 3rdJanuary when we will be launching the training. 


Year 5 - Loop the Loop
