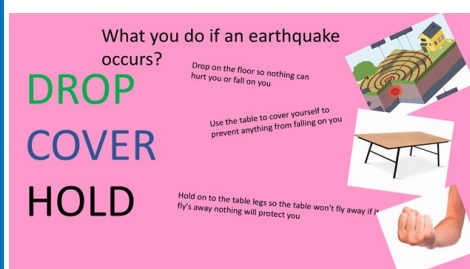

Year 3—Tremors

Year 3 have loved starting their new Geography topic - 'Tremors'. Last week, we came back to our classrooms to discover our own mini natural disaster had occurred over breaktime! We looked around our classrooms for clues and realised that there had been an EARTHQUAKE! We then learnt how children in countries where earthquakes are common, are taught to stay safe when an earthquake happens. They follow the instructions: 'drop, cover, hold!'. We made our own information posters to help teach these children how to stay safe.

This week, we have also learnt about the layers of the earth and the differences between physical and human geography, as this will later help us to understand how volcanoes erupt and why earthquakes occur. We explored a map of the UK to test our knowledge of some significant physical and human geography features!
