We get on the boat at Morston and have a ride out to Blakeney Point to see the seals. We learn all about the seals and if we are lucky, we even see some pups.





This year we will got the whole experience – to and from the point on the boat. After that, we will get to explore some of the other coastal habitats.



#### In the evening

We have activities every evening – and hot chocolate and biscuits before bed!

The disco! – An opportunity to get dressed up and let your hair down!

The Story-teller – we enter the room to find mystery objects and strange objects. The story-teller makes a grand entrance and the story begins.

#### Accommodation

- Boys and Girls dorms with bunk beds. Children assigned rooms by teacher. We will reveal the rooms to the children on arrival.
- Adult accommodation is directly next door to rooms!
- Bedtime will be no later than 9pm, final lights out 9.20pm
- Children can get up from anytime after 7:00am
- Children will be expected to wash/shower daily.
   Basically, organise themselves and be healthy.
- The children are also expected to supply their own quilt cover and pillowcase – which they have to put on! So, the more experience they have in this before they go the better!!


## Food

- Breakfast plenty of it, cereals, English breakfast and toast.

## Cost

Dear Parents/Carers,

#### Year 4 Residential Trip - Aylmerton Norfolk - Monday 23rd - 27th October 2022

We are really excited to advise all parents that we have provisionally booked next year's residential trip to Aylmerton in Norfolk. The cost of the trip is £320 per child which includes: full board, activities and lodging, transport to and from the Aylmerton Field Centre and to and from all activity venues during our week-long stay and all necessary insurances required for the trip. Very few things can match the experience of a residential holiday and memories gained from it last a lifetime.

Please could we ask you to complete the ParentMail Form confirming that you wish for your child to attend and to take part in all activities: woodland hide building, twilight safari, visit to Blakeney for marsh and dune habitats studies, beach walks, pirate and treasure hunt activities, visit to a contrasting locality in Cromer, walk to West Runton and an animals in their habitats boat trip; and that full payment will be made in line with the payment schedule detailed below, before 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

A non-refundable deposit of £70.00 is required to secure a place for your child – please could this be paid by Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2022 to enable us to know firm numbers and start to work on preparing for the trip.

We hope that spreading the payments over 6 months between now and next June, will allow more time for payment and enable as many pupils as possible to attend.

#### Please note that children entitled to Pupil Premium receive 25% discount on the total of the trip (cost will be £240.00)
