## SIAMS INSPECTION OUTCOME

#### I am delighted to announce that that the outcome of our SIAMS Inspection is an overall grading of 'Excellent'

We were also given a grading of 'Excellent' for the impact of Collective Worship. These are the highest outcomes possible under the current inspection framework and replace the 'Outstanding' grades of the previous one. This is a fantastic achievement for our whole school community and fully recognises all the hard work of everyone involved.

The final report highlights many of the great things which happen to enable both pupils and adults to thrive. During the inspection, all the children were fantastic representatives of our school and spoke knowledgeably and proudly about what happens at school every day.

Our wonderful ethos and environment is thanks to the energy, skills and commitment of our whole school community –parents, children, staff, advisory board members, the church, our academy Discovery and other local people. It's a huge team effort and we feel so fortunate to be part of such a supportive and caring 'family'.

As part of the process, the inspector looked in detail at seven strands, including the school vision and leadership, the progress of pupils, our relationship with the community, opportunities for all members of the school community to explore their spirituality, and our impact as global citizens.

A huge thank you to all the hard-working staff, who care deeply about the children here and strive for excellence every day. And also to the parents and children who spoke to the SIAMS inspector and were so positive about our school.

- The vision is exceptionally well-embedded and is intrinsic in every aspect of school life
- Lives are transformed and pupils and adults flourish
- Pupils flourish exceptionally well as they constantly strive 'to let their light shine'

- Pupils regard school as a safe space to express their views and feel comfortable in approaching any member of staff
- There is a deep sense of peace and watching over one another in love
- Concern for mental health and wellbeing is a key priority and strength of the school.
