

KIBWORTH PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.

Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- gives a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class;
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents;
- is designed with health and safety in mind.
- is appropriate for the children to engage in the curriculum e.g. PE, Games, Outdoor Education.

Our uniform consists of: shirts, cardigans, fleece jackets, baseball caps,

- Blue sweatshirt or cardigan embroidered with school logo
- White polo shirt or long sleeved shirt
- Dark grey trousers, knee length tailored shorts or skirt or a blue checked dress
- Grey or white socks or grey tights
- Black polishable school shoes (not trainers)
- A suitable coat

In Summer children are also welcome to wear:

- Blue checked dress
- Grey tailored shorts

For P.E. lessons

Indoor PE

- Black Pumps
- House coloured T shirt
- Black shorts

Outdoor PE

- Sweatshirt
- Jogging trousers (no logo)
- Trainers (no logo)

(All children need both kits)

ALL UNIFORM SHOULD BE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH CHILD'S NAME AND CLASS.

Jewellery

Due to Health and Safety regulations, is not allowed in our school. The exception to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears. We ask the children to remove these objects during swimming, PE and games, to prevent them from causing injury.

Hair Styles

Long hair should be tied up for Health and Safety reasons. It is expected that haircuts will be smart and not extreme. Hair decorations, for example bows and clips, should be in the school colours and small in size.

Footwear

We require all children to wear black shoes, no heels. Trainers are not acceptable.

The role of parents

Parents have a responsibility to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school appropriately dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. It is the responsibility of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, including PE kit and that it is clean and in a state of good repair. If children wear the wrong uniform to school a letter will be sent home requesting that this is rectified.

School Uniform Policy

If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should write, in the first instance, to the head teacher.

Monitoring and review

The governing body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its committee work by:

- seeking the views of parents, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy;
- considering, with the head teacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform;
- requiring the head teacher to report to the governors on the way the school uniform policy is implemented.
