#### Year 3 - Plants


As part of their topic 'Predators', Year 3 have been learning all about plants and what they need to survive. Each class has planted two sunflower seeds; one seed to look after and provide everything that it needs, and one seed to be kept in the dark.




As scientists, we have observed that the healthy plant is green, and the plant kept in the dark is white so far! They will continue to observe the differences between the plants over the term.

As part of their home learning, Year 3 have created posters to explain the uses of each part of a plant. They learnt how the roots absorb water from the soil and transport it through the plant. This water is then evaporated through the leaves so that more water can be absorbed. The children took part in an experiment to see if they could carefully transport water through a plant themselves!

This week, the children have also learnt that some plants catch and eat insects for their food and are actually predators! The children designed their own carnivorous plants based on some plants that they have learnt about.
