Year 4 – Coronation

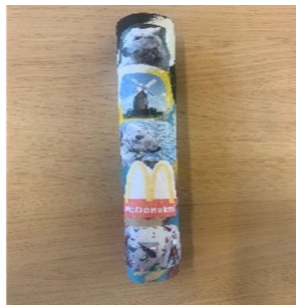

Year 4 have really enjoyed learning about the history of the USA. We learnt what totem poles represent and why Native Americans have them. There were some fantastic totem poles made for homework. We then learnt about Christopher Columbus, and how he arrived in America and when the first Pilgrims travelled there for a new life. We found out about the celebration of Thanksgiving which became a tradition in 1621.

We then learnt how unfortunately, friendships between the Native Americans and the English settlers quickly faded, leading to fighting over the land which resulted in people such as Rosa Parks fighting for black people's rights. We then used this knowledge to write a diary entry as Rosa Parks and how she must have felt on that important day in history when she refused to give up her seat on the bus to a white man.
