Firstly, is the academic success of our year 1 children who achieved 97% in the Phonics Screening check. We are also proud that our Year 2 children who retook the check achieved 100%. This is a brilliant

achievement for all those children and shows how hard they have worked to perfect their reading. We have also had the results back from our Year 4 Multiplication Check, which tests the children's rapid recall of their times tables to 12x12. We are very pleased that 99% of our children scored over 20 and an amazing 72% scored 25/25. This is a fantastic achievement and will really help the children's calculation fluency as they move into upper key stage 2. We have also had further success in sport with a great result for our hockey team, which you will already know about if you read a newspaper in the same way as my dad, from the back! We were even more pleased to win the Spirit of the Games award too.

Finally, just a thank you to everyone who joined us for our sports days. It was fantastic to have such a great atmosphere for the children to compete in.
