The children be learning about how to ask questions and how to write them. They will be writing questions to superheroes.


2. Supertato narrative

Reading


The children will be learning the story of Supertato and retelling it.

Maths

Addition and subtraction to 20

Place value to 50

In maths the children will continue to use a very practical approach. This term the children will build upon last term's work on number bonds to 10 and learn their number bonds to 20. They will learn them systematically to help them to solve addition and subtraction facts.

The children will learn about place value to 50. They will learn to count forwards and backwards from any given number within 50 and identify the tens and ones in a number. The children will compare and order numbers within 50.

Key areas of learning:

Gymnastics

Children will know how: - to move on, off and over apparatus - to rock on different parts of our body and rock using shape. - to perform specific point balances - to perform actions at the same time as others (unison) - to perform actions one person after the other (canon). - to turn and jump and quarter and half turn.

OAA

Children will know how: - to follow simple instructions to complete a trail. - to find matching symbols. to copy and create a hoop dance. - to work with a partner to complete a hoop challenge. - to recognise a drawn symbol as a real object, e.g. square = ball. - to use decision-making skills to hide equipment.

What do Christians believe God is like?

In this topic we will read and discuss some parables that help Christians to understand God and their relationship with him.

We will also learn about the different ways in which Christians pray to God-through thanks, praise, saying sorry and asking for something.

We will start to make links between the parables and how we can forgive and ask for forgiveness ourselves. The children will learn how more important aspects of staying safe online. The children will also begin to learn about programming and use Beebots to give instructions.
